

We offered 5 learning fellowships in 2021 where over 80 students enrolled to participate in weekly Jewish learning.

100 students gathered to #ShineALight on **Antisemitism while** skiing on the 8th night of Hanukkah!

Over 1,500 students directly engaged with Hillel events over the last year. We know that students who engage with Jewish life in college are more likely to make an enduring commitment to Jewish life.



Our students formed multiple new Hillel communities,

including the Bamidbar Wilderness Explorers. They

hosted multiple events in the fall that created Jewish

experiences in nature for nearly 200 students.



Nearly 600 Jewish students turned to us to celebrate Jewish holidays in 2021. We offered educational, spiritual, and physical opportunities to connect each holiday in a way that felt meaningful to them.



Hillel nearly doubled our number of philanthropic supporters in 2021. It is thanks to these donors that we are able to be there for so many different students!


